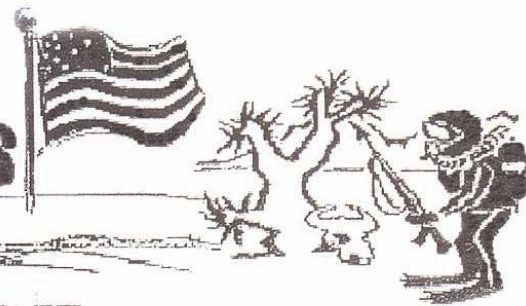

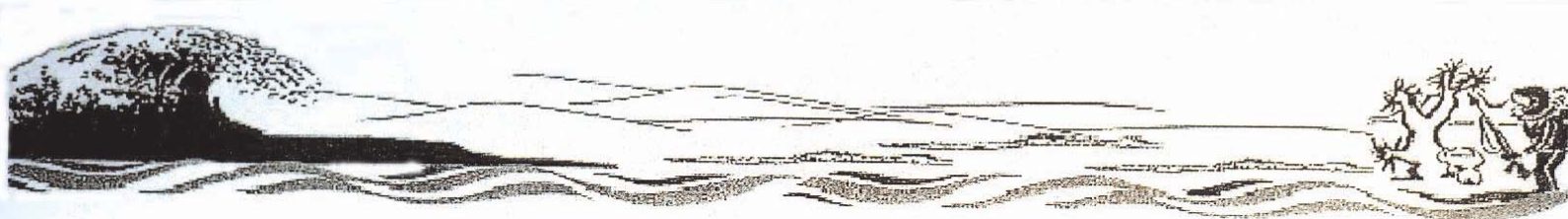

Sushi Awareness

Well guys and gals, I have noticed a number of new Sushi restaurants in town. Now I have haven't had a chance to try them all out yet, but Linda and I will definitely be making our rounds. In this endeavor we will be thinking about an article that I recently read and thought that I would share with you.

Tuna are the Olympians of the sea-fast, efficient swimmers able to reach speeds of 50 miles an hour and cross ocean basins. These magnificent animals are also tasty and bluefin tuna belly is prized by sushi eaters around the world for its rich flavor and texture. Sadly, our appetite for this delicacy has led to high prices, overfishing and the near collapse of bluefin populations worldwide.

What You Can Do:

- * Avoid ordering bluefin tuna.
- * Try albacore tuna (shiro maguro) instead; it tastes similar and is a best choice when troll caught in the US or Canada.
- * Let your chef know that you prefer sustainable seafood.
- * Help protect bluefin tuna breeding grounds.
- * Learn more about what's troubling our oceans.

Dec 8th AVDD Holiday Potluck and Yankee Swap Gift Exchange

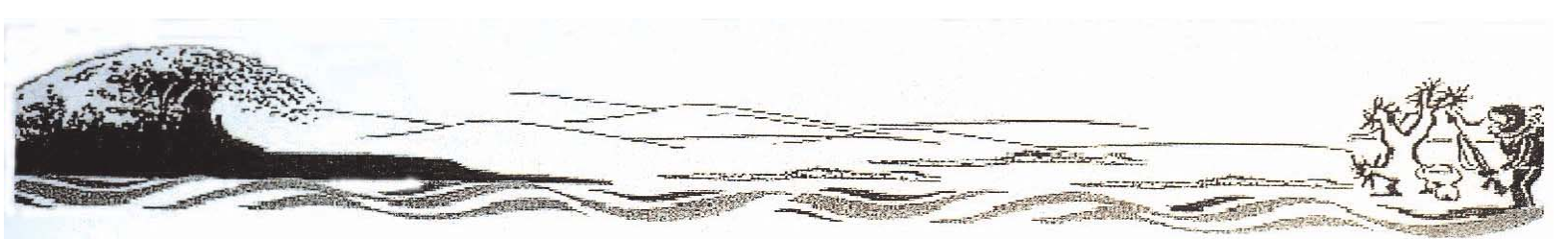

Sunfish Dive

The morning was brown with smoke from the wild fires. The sun rose into a brown, windy day. The crews of the Sunfish were friendly and well trained. As we left the harbor the Captain said we were going to try and "out run the wind".

One thing for sure, there was a lot of wind, blowing offshore. The boat was cruising in trailing seas and breakfast went well. There was a south swell running in the back of the island (Santa Cruz). So down the front we went. Past Scorpion Rock, Past Potato Rock, Past Prisoners Harbor, Past Pelican Anchorage, finally finding some calm waters down around Diablo Point.

The first dive was in 25ft vis & 56 degree water. The kelp was long and beautiful. The harbor seals teased us as we tried to get pictures of their ghostly bodies. Large sheep head swam in groups waiting for your fin to stir up something new. Kelp bass darted about with the flash of the camera.

The second dive was glorious combinations of schools of blue perch being chased by harbor seals feeding, darting about causing the school to flash to and fro. Lunch was a great combo of sandwiches and homemade soup.

The last dive was only made by a few hardy divers (Larry Ladd). The water was a bit clearer and some bugs were spotted, but none taken. A few scallops came on board and a lesson in cleaning them was provided by Terry Hodgkins.

The afternoon brought the Santa Ana winds to a halt & the sea laid down for a pleasant trip home in the afternoon sun. Some slept and some ate, but all had a great time.
