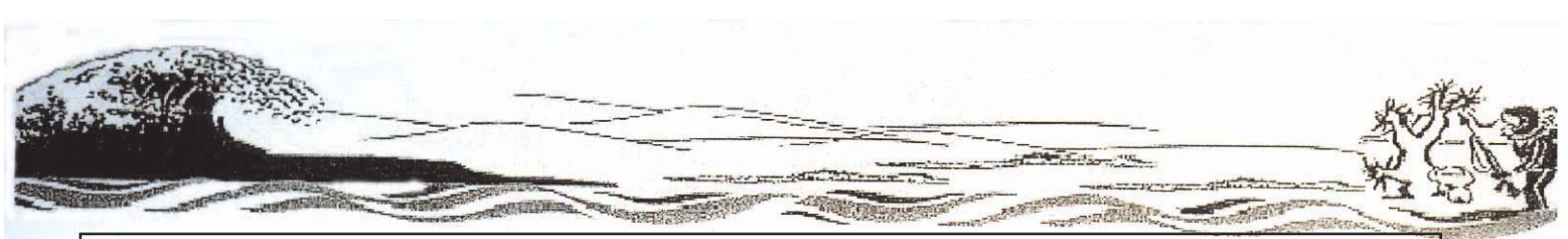

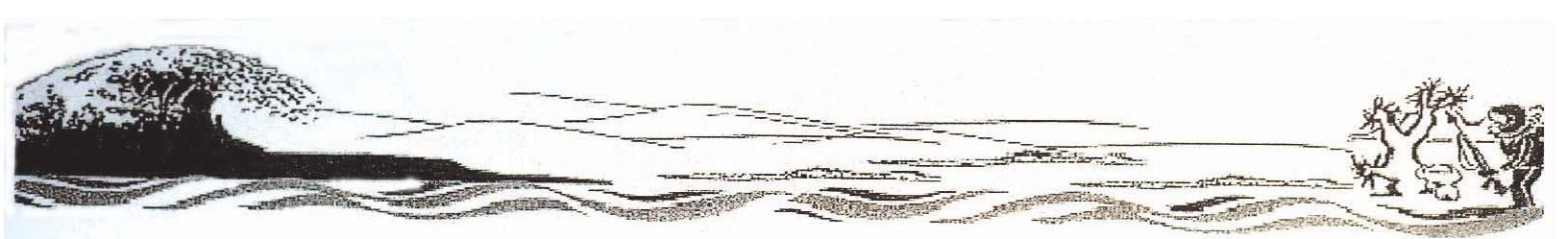

June Lake and the Altitude Diver Specialty

Many of our members have been traveling yearly to make the dives at June Lake. June Lake is at an altitude of 7612 feet above sea level. This past year, we had one case of decompression illness reported for the dive. There may have been others in the past, but I am not aware of them. If you have been making this dive for many years and have had no decompression problems, that is great. You are, however, living on borrowed time, if you haven't made the effort to understand all of the implications of diving at altitude.

The PADI Altitude Diver Specialty Class is a good way to quickly gain the knowledge you need to dive safely at altitude. Every dive that takes place at an altitude higher than 999 feet, is technically an altitude dive and requires special considerations for dive planning and execution to prevent decompression problems. I will be offering this class at a reduced rate to club members. See me for scheduling and prices. There is one classroom session, one knowledge review, and two open water dives at altitude. Arm yourself with the knowledge you need to dive safely when you participate in this annual AV Desert Divers pilgrimage.

21st Annual CHAMBER DAY

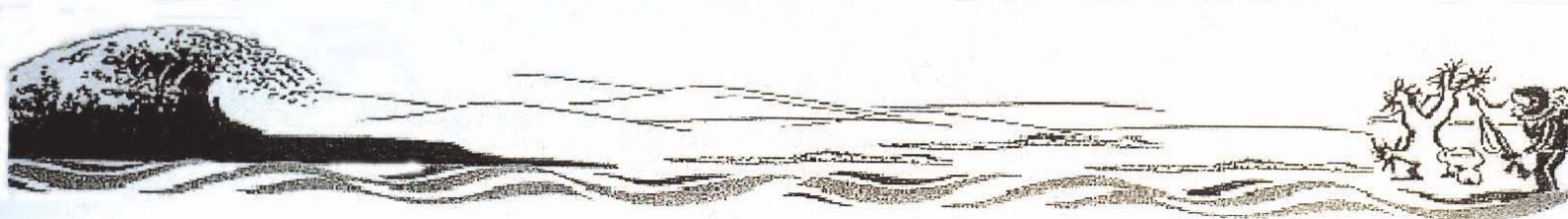

Keep an eye out for this next Generation “gotta have” vehicle. I can’t wait for Jack and Mike’s “specialty class” on this one. In true James Bond style, a Swiss automobile visionary has now created the “sQuba”. It is goes in water and on land. I do mean “IN” water. Although it can drive on top of the water it can also go under the water. This one comes equipped with life support systems of two on board compressed air cylinders from ScubaPro with standard regulators. So grab your mask and jump in. 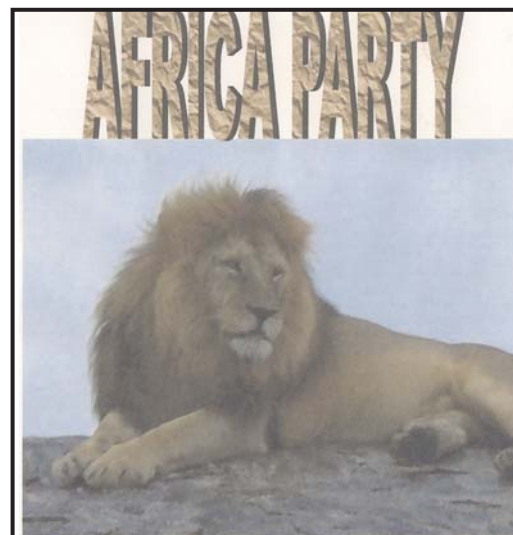
