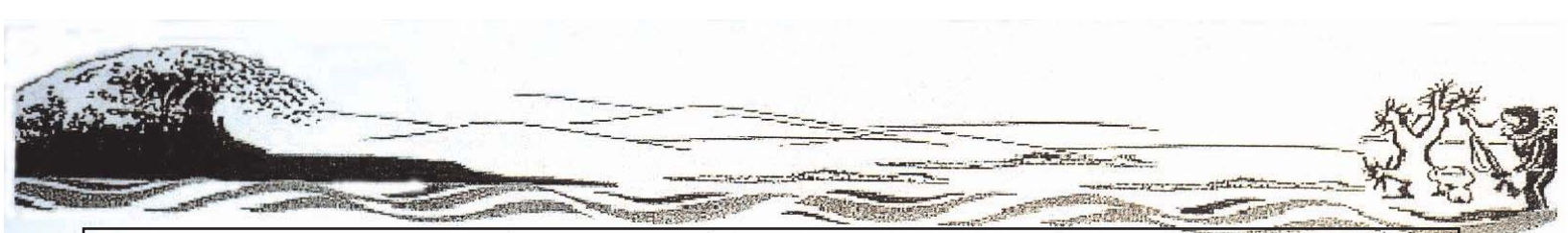

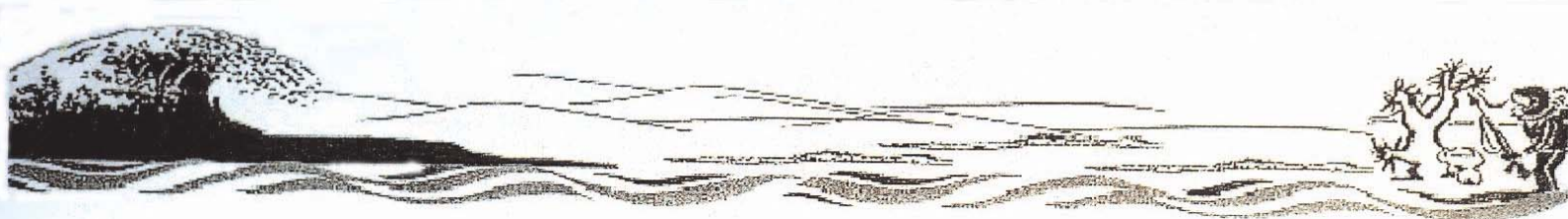
Here Lobster, Lobster, Lobster, Lobster!!!!

Lobster season 2009 opened October 3rd at 12am, and runs through March 17, 2010. Remember, the rules changed last season. In addition to your California fishing license with saltwater endorsement, and a measuring device, you also have to use a lobster report card to record where you collected from. The report card should be available from the same location you bought your fishing license. Please adhere to legal size and bag limits. If you do come across that big "Bull" out there, take your picture with him and release him. His survival could make the difference in a healthy lobster population for future generations of divers. 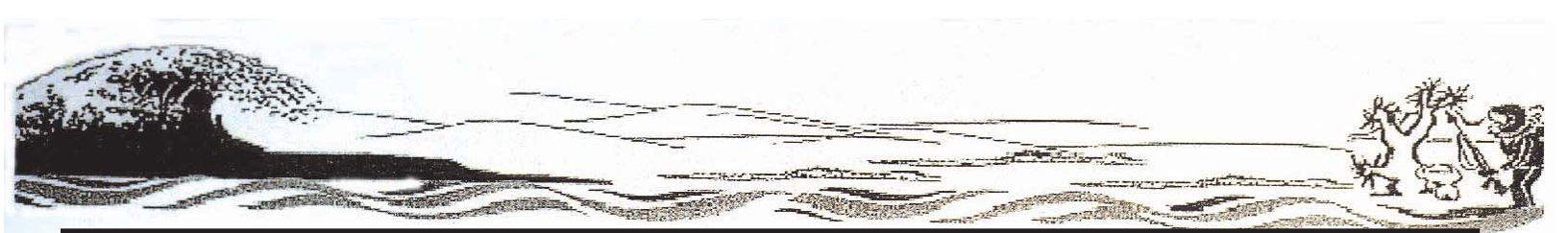

Greetings Divers!

I am really excited to announce to you the Monterey Bay Aquarium has another Great White shark on exhibit in the million gallon Outer Bay tank. This magnificent animal is a 5ft 3in long female that was collected from the waters near Malibu. Monterey is currently the only aquarium to have a Great White on exhibit. Like the four Great Whites before her, she will be on exhibit until she becomes too large to keep for her safety and that of the divers who feed her. You should stop in and check her out. Thank you from AVDD to all who were able to attend. And thank you to the local merchants, club members, and Sport Chalet, who so generously contributed prizes for the raffle. To all who missed the September meeting, I regret to inform you that you missed a good and informative presentation from Brian Meux of Santa Monica Bay Keepers. Brian spoke to us about the progress that has been made with the Bay Keepers kelp restoration project, the Marine Life Protection Act (MPLA), and development of Marine Protected Areas (MPA's). Brian informed us that the final proposal from the stake holders (commercial fisherman, recreational fisherman, preservationists) has been submitted and decisions will be made as to the extent and location of the MPA's. Any that have dove in, or fished this area can not deny the decline in abundance of numbers of larger fishes of all game species. The studies of existing MPA's indicate that populations of game fish benefit from protected areas, and that increased population "spill over" into areas outside the MPA and benefit commercial and recreational fishermen.

Calling all Rescue Divers! Santa Monica Bay Keepers needs volunteer divers! The Bay Keepers operate a research vessel three or four days a week and need the help of divers certified as Rescue Diver, with or without research experience. The benefits are free boat dives and satisfaction of restoring kelp forests we all love to dive in. I would like to contact Brian and offer the support of AVDD. Bay Keepers runs their boat on both weekdays and weekends (Saturday). If you are a Rescue Diver, and are interested in joining in on this, please contact me at: dnipper@water.ca.gov
