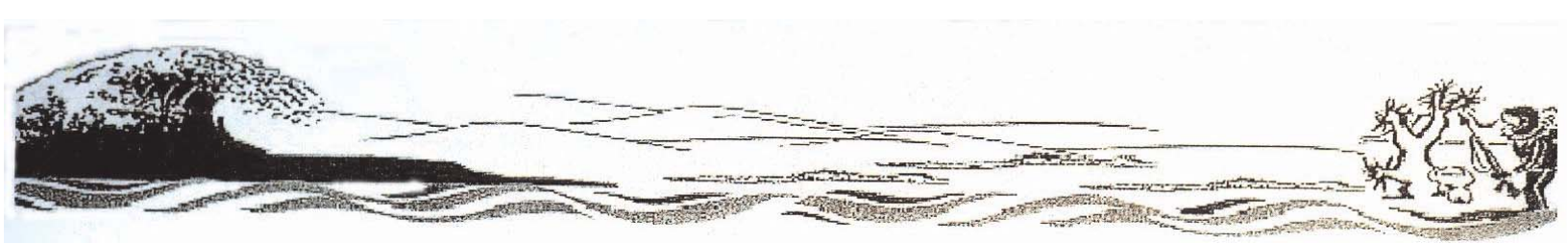

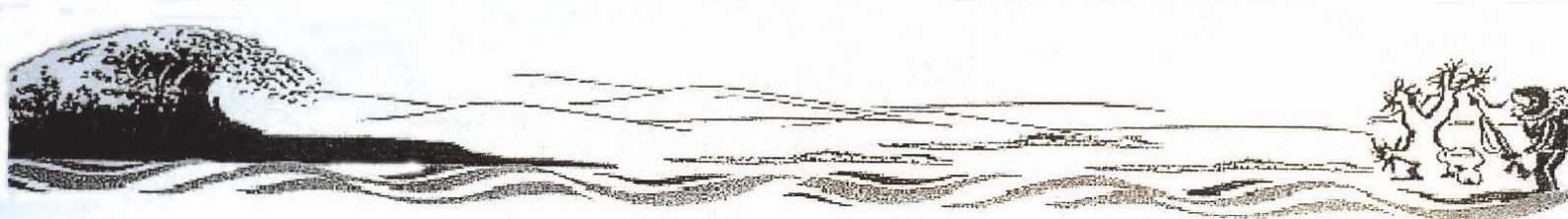
Origins of Belly Dance



As with any dance of folkloric origin, the roots of belly dance are uncertain. The authenticity of even “traditional” or “classical” forms of belly dance is open to question and often hotly disputed.

One theory is that belly dance was originally danced by women for women, to demonstrate or ease childbirth in Iran, India, and North Africa. This is the most popular and realistic theory. This theory is very popular in Western dance schools because it helps counteract negative sexual stereotyping, but there is no written evidence to support it. The book “Dancer of Shamahka” is widely cited, but it is in fact, a romanticized memoir written by a modern author, Armen Ohanian, published in 1918. In Middle Eastern society two specific belly dance movements have been used in childbirth for generations, but this fact is insufficient to account for the history of a complex dance used primarily for public performance.

While these theories may have some foundation, none of them can be proved to be the origin of belly dance. It is more likely that all these factors contributed to the development of belly dance as we know it today.

Hi Desert Divers, I'm Larry Ladd, Your new Conservation Officer for the 2010-2011 time frame.

As Conservation Officer I will try to keep you abreast of all the things Glen Beck, Sean Hannity, and Bill O'Rieley have to offer on the never ending Conservation front,,,, Wait, Vicki just informed me that I'm the new Conservation Officer, NOT the Conservative Officer, Dang! and here I thought I had all these great ideas to share with you all, But now I have to talk about boring old stuff like fishing licenses, Fish stories, Beach clean-ups, and all kinds of other mundane things like that.

But now that I know what I'm really doing, How about talking about fishing licenses?

If you haven't already laid out the bucks for a 2010 license, Be advised that like all things in California, the price has gone up! It's \$41.20 for the basic resident sport fishing license, and another \$4.75 for the Ocean enhancement sticker, The lobster tag and log are another \$8.40. Whale vomit will cost ya!

Sydney - A family on the south Australian coast found a piece of whale vomit on the beach that is tipped to be worth hundreds of thousands of dollars, national radio reported on Tuesday.

The chunk of ambergris, which is sought after by perfume manufacturers, weighed 14.75kg and is worth about \$20 per gram, ABC radio said - making a total of \$295 000.
