## Speaker for Febuary 16th meeting...

### Palau, Yap Adventure

What better way to kickoff my retirement then a dive trip with LaRae to Micronesia. Our adventure in diving the Islands of Palau and Yap started with the usual pre-trip planning and packing. As in all great plans, some last minute adjustments were needed, due to an unexpected foot of snow in the Antelope Valley. So after cutting down snow damaged branches and clearing the driveway of snow, we were ready to fly to a warm tropical paradise.

Paradise for us started at the Palau Pacific Resort for four fantastic days, of snorkeling, kayaking, and exploring the historic jungle surroundings. After our above water discovery of a WW2 Japanese Sea plane port, caves with armament still in place, and jungle flowers up close, we were primed for some world class diving.

The next seven days on board the Eco Explorer can only be expressed as diving heaven. We got to dive sites with names like, Blue Hole, Ngemedis Coral Garden, Big Drop-off, German Channel, Siaes Tunnel, Turtle Cove, and Ulong Channel. On these dives we saw large graceful Manta Rays, Eagle Rays, Black and white tip Sharks, Turtles, schools of Barracuda, and tropical fish of every size, shape and color imaginable.

The final four days of our tropical adventure was diving around the Island of Yap. Here we got really close and personal with Manta Rays, Sharks and some colorful mating Mandarin Fish. Now that's the way to end 2008 and start the New Year.

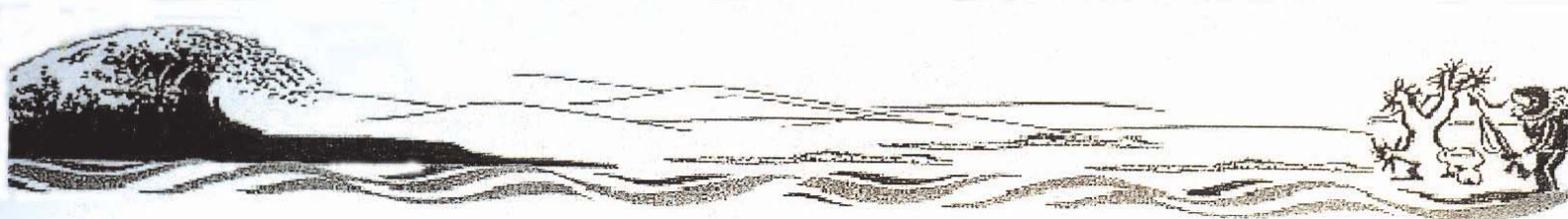

## Top Quality DVDs Sought for Underwater Film Festival

Assemble now your best underwater video film footage for the SCUBA Show 2009 underwater film festival. The 22nd annual SCUBA Show is the largest dive expo of its type in the U.S. and this year takes place May 30-31 (the weekend AFTER Labor Day) at the Long Beach Convention Center.

One of the most popular portions of the annual Southern California SCUBA Show has been the unique continuous underwater film festival. Films will be displayed digitally on a massive screen and viewed by thousands of attendees. Featured at past film festivals have been footage, videos and films from some of the world's greatest underwater cinematographers. Even so, some of the most well received films have been from non-professional and semi-professional underwater camera operators.

For this year's show, the film festival will be wide open to this talented group. The management of the popular annual dive convention is conducting an aggressive all-out search for the best in underwater video films. They are also opening up the category to include digital still presentations set to music or narration. Films and digital slide shows of 3 to 30 minutes in length are preferred, but shorter is usually better. Footage can be from anywhere in the world, but the video should contain at least 50 percent underwater footage. Those films accepted for screening will be paid an honorarium.
