Clam Chowder Dive - June 13, 2020



Our Annual Clam Chowder Dive on June 13, 2020 is going to look a little different this year. We will be moving the dive from Leo Carrillo in Malibu to Ventura where the beaches are more open. Depending on whether or not Ventura beaches are permitting leisurely activities (e.g., sunbathing, picnicking, cooking delicious clam chowder), we may be moving the clam chowder portion of our dive to a host's home, details TBD.

The dive will be La Jenelle Park in Port Hueneme on the corner of Ocean Drive and Sawtelle Ave. Here's what you can expect:

áAccess: Rocky surf entry. Best Diving Depths: 25 to 80 feet.

Skill: Intermediate.

Visibility: Averages 15 feet.

Hunting: Spearfishing poor. Occasional halibut. Occasional lobster.

Photography: Good macro and wide-angle; challenging entry/exit with camera.

There is also a nearby submarine canyon that is accessible from La Jenelle.

There is an added hazard of this dive site as there is a harbor nearby, so you will need to use your navigation skills to stay out of the harbor.

Check the website and Facebook for more details as the dive gets closer.




Next Dive Aug 8th




I'm sharing a photo of the last remnants of my quarantine supplies. Could this be our new yummy food to build an event around?
