

T-shirts are Needed


Tina Carlon would like to have any of your old AVDD related T-shirts, even if they are stained, faded or ripped!


Hello Desert Divers!

Like many club members, I also carry his name on many of my scuba certifications. He was a great Instructor and advocate of recreational scuba diving. I send my personal condolences to his family. He will be missed, I wish you Fair Winds and Following Seas.

Thank you to all who were able to participate in our June Lake Cleanup/High Altitude dive this year. A special thanks to the non-members that came out to dive with us from as far away as Las Vegas. By all accounts it was a total success; right up to the time they shut down the campgrounds and forced everyone to leave. The smoke from the Creek fire was terrible. While LA air quality was 90, the Mammoth and June Lake areas were 600. At times visibility was down to not much more than 100 feet. And breathing the smoke, well..... Anyway, everyone escaped and returned home safely. I look forward to going back next year, which I hope will be Rona-free.

Covid-19 threw us a curve ball this year that we just couldn't hit. Our annual participation in Coastal Cleanup Day was a bust. Our large scale beach cleanup was changed to smaller, localized events. It was hoped that the multitude of volunteers that normally participated in the single day event would take the ball and run with it. If you have pictures of a cleanup that you did, please forward them to me and I will submit them to Heal the Bay for publication. We did register our June Lake activities with Project Aware, and I will include that cleanup data as a contribution to Coastal Cleanup Month.

Hunters, California Spiny Lobster season opens this month! Are you ready? I hope you got your 19/20 report card in on time. If you didn't, expect to pay \$20 more for your 20/21 report card as a penalty. As always you'll need your CDFG fishing license with an ocean enhancement AND a lobster report card. Other required equipment include a gauge capable of accurately measuring your 31/4" catch. I suggest buying one and not depending on your fabrication skills to build one, Remember, the only gauge the Game Warden will believe is accurate is HIS. Don't get caught with a "short", it's not worth getting your gear confiscated. Most important of all... dive safe and CHECK YOUR AIR OFTEN, no bug is worth dying for.
