

Underwater contest is open to all certified divers (valid "C" card must be shown). Younger participants, ages 5 to 10, will create their pumpkins poolside, with pens. Awards will be given for

Best Underwater AVDD Club Theme Carving (Grand Marshall "Little Gnome" Award), Underwater Carving- 1st, 2nd and 3rd and Best Poolside- 1st, 2nd & 3rd. Bring your own scuba gear, there will be some scuba gear available on a firstcome-first-serve basis. You may only use the safe cutting tool provided, no personal knives permitted. Underwater carvings may only be done underwater and within the time limit.







June Lake clean-up

Did you hear about the June Lake clean-up this year? We had such a positive experience that it needed its own article this month. First off, our clean-up was an overwhelming success. It is now part of Project Aware "Dive Against Debris" data base. If you go to their website and look at the world map, you can find June Lake and see we registered two dive sites there. The Oh-Ridge beach and the June Lake Marina. When Project Aware heard about our clean-up, they asked us to do it under their "Dive Against Debris" for data collection. What this means for us is that any trash we collect at our two dive sites, we can record the weight and contents so that it will continue to add to their data and help in their efforts to reduce the amount of trash getting into our waterways.

One of the workers at the marina posted a picture of our cleanup on their local social media page and the community response was a huge outpouring of support. Many people commented that they couldn't believe we had been doing it for over 30 years without them knowing!

This year we offered the opportunity for divers to earn their high altitude certifications, as well as the PADI Dive against debris specialty certification. And we will continue offering this each year at the cleanup, since it is a perfect opportunity for both!

This all adds up to mean next year is going to be even more successful. Some members of the June Lake community asked us to give them an earlier notification of our event so they can take a more active role in helping us get the word out on their social media platforms. This year we had a few local businesses donate to our raffle at the pot-luck and more want to donate next year.

The owner of the June Lake Marina is a certified diver and wants to take part in the clean up next year. We will have our 2020 clean-up listed on the Project Aware website and once again weigh and record our debris to add to our "Dive Against Debris" data collection. The amount of trash we got out this year was 429 lbs. As you can see this event becomes more successful each year and



next year is no exception.

I hope you all can make room in your busy schedule to join us.

Ahoy Divers & Land-lubber Volunteers!



As a lot of you already know, Heal the Bay partners with the California Coastal Commission in participation in Coastal Clean Up Day 2019 (the GLOBAL event, this year September 21st). Heal the Bay coordinated 79 sites and 13,914 Volunteers that picked up over 30,000 pounds of trash across LA County on Coastal Clean Up Day 2019. AVDD's adopted beach, Dan Blocker, was cleaned to perfection. We did have several volunteers that had resemblance to a mountain goat who brave the steep hillside to remove trash there. Our CCD site is listed as Corral Canyon/Dan Blocker if you had trouble finding it. And if you tried to register later, you found that you could not because it had filled up. Sorry, better not wait next year. At Corral Canyon/Dan Blocker County Beaches we had 114 volunteers, a good number of them were children (17yrs & under) and it didn't look like they were being forced to participate. Those motivated volunteers picked up 404 lbs of trash (134.5 lbs recyclables donated to the homeless) and waited patiently for the raffle to begin at high noon.

This event marks AVDD Third Coastal Clean Up Day and it is shaping into an annual club commitment. Hughes Research Laboratory joined us again this year. HRL volunteers worked side by side with AVDD and managed the CCD site flawlessly. HRL and AVDD donated prizes for the volunteers raffle. HRL donated two very nice bamboo (very sustainable) beach chairs. AVDD donated a very nice Tusa scuba mask, and HTB donated a nifty reusable beach bag. Betty Loo of HRL found the Golden Sea Star and was presented a Bamboo Chair. The remaining chair was won by "Swifty" of HRL, and the Scuba Mask was won by a Boy Scout troop leader.

What about that nifty reusable beach bag that EVERYBODY was eyeballin'? Well we had something thing that I though was really cool. Ally, no last name, wanted for her 12th birthday, to participate in Coastal Clean Up Day 2019. Ally brought her birthday party to Dan Blocker beach to pick up trash. AVDD/HRL/HTB was pleased (ecstatic) to present to her THE nifty reusable beach bag. Go Ally!!!!

Getting too Little Cayman. The best way is to fly from the U.S. mainland to Grand Cayman (GCM). Then take the puddle jumper from Grand Cayman over to Little Cayman. **Travelers will need a current passport with a minimum of 6 months remaining on their passport**.

Please be advised this is a very small island (10 Sq. Mi.) so there are <u>very</u> limited top side activities.
